

## ORDINANCE NO. 35

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 16 ENTITLED  
 "AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING RATES AND CHARGES FOR  
 SEWAGE DISPOSAL SERVICE AND PROVIDING PROCEDURES  
 FOR ITS ENFORCEMENT"

## SUNNYSLOPE COUNTY WATER DISTRICT

BE IT ORDAINED by the Board of Directors of the Sunnyslope  
 County Water District, San Benito County, California, as follows:

Section 1. Article VIII of Ordinance No. 16, entitled "An  
 Ordinance Establishing Rates and Charges for Sewage Disposal Service and  
 Providing Procedures for Its Enforcement," passed and adopted  
 August 10, 1972, as amended, is hereby amended by amending Section 70  
 thereof, to read as follows:

"70. Rate Schedule. Sewer service charges are hereby  
 established as follows:

<u>Service Charges</u>	<u>Charge Per Month</u>
1. Single family dwelling	\$ 8.00
2. Multiple family dwellings, duplexes, flats and apartments	8.00/unit
3. Auto courts, motels, trailer parks	4.00/unit
4. Office buildings, hotels, rooming house: First unit	8.00
Each additional unit	3.20
5. Commercial houses, schools, churches: First fixture	8.00
Each additional toilet, urinal, shower, laundrette unit, restaurant, sink, dishwasher, wash rack, etc.	3.20
6. Industrial, business, laundries, launderettes, restaurants, bars, theatres, service stations, garages, chemical plants	8.00 minimum plus .41 per 100 cu. ft. of water used in excess of 1000 cu. ft.

The District shall have the option of charging all large users on  
 the basis of volume of sewage discharged into the sewer system.

The metered discharge from those pumps having a final discharge  
 into the sewer system shall be charged on the same basis as metered water  
 furnished by the District.

For any business or occupancy not listed, the charge shall be in such amount as may be established by District, by motion, resolution or ordinance.

District shall have the option of providing sewer service outside the boundaries of District on the basis of charges to be established by special sewer service agreement."

Section 2. This Ordinance shall be posted in three public places within the District.

Section 3. This Ordinance shall take effect February 1, 1987.

Section 4. All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.

RESOLUTION NO. 414A RESOLUTION MAKING FINDINGS AND  
DETERMINATION OF EXEMPTION PURSUANT  
TO CALIFORNIA ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY ACT  
AND MAKING FINDINGS AND  
DETERMINATIONS RELATING TO  
SEWER AND WATER CHARGES

## SUNNYSLOPE COUNTY WATER DISTRICT

RESOLVED, by the Board of Directors of the Sunnyslope County Water District, San Benito County, California, as follows:

WHEREAS, the District Engineer has made a report and recommendations on revisions in the District's sewer and water charges, dated November 7, 1986, which report and recommendations have been filed with the District; and

WHEREAS, the public interest, convenience and necessity will be served thereby;

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY FOUND AND DETERMINED THAT

1. The revisions proposed in the Sunnyslope County Water District's sewer and water regulations and charges pursuant to said report and recommendations submitted to the District are exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act pursuant to Section 21080 of the Public Resources Code of the State of California and especially subsection (b) (8) thereof which provides that the establishment, modification, structuring, restructuring, or approval of rates, tolls, fares or other charges by public agencies which the public agency finds are for the purpose of meeting operating expenses, purchasing or leasing supplies, meeting financial reserve needs and requirements or obtaining funds for capital projects, necessary to maintain services within existing service areas may be exempt.

2. The proposed revisions in the sewer and water charges, in accordance with the report and recommendations shall be, and they are hereby, found to be necessary to permit the District to raise funds for the purposes stated in Section 1 hereof. It is hereby specifically found that without the revisions in sewer and water charges proposed in said report, the District will be unable to meet the expenses of operating its sewer and water facilities in order to satisfy the purposes for which the charges were established.

3. Pursuant to Chapter 13, Division 2, Title 5 of the Government Code commencing with Section 54990 thereof, the District hereby determines that no persons have filed written requests for mailed notice of the meeting at which increased sewer and water fees or charges were to be considered and, at least 10 days prior to the date of this meeting, January 8, 1987, made available to the public data indicating the amount of cost or estimated cost, required to satisfy the purpose for which the sewer and water charges were to be levied and the revenue sources anticipated to provide the funds to pay such costs, including general fund revenues, and hereby further finds;

A. That all notices required to be given and made were given and made.

B. That the material required to be made available to the public were available within the time required by law.

C. That the proposed revised sewer and water charges, together with other available funds and revenues do not exceed the costs or estimated costs required to provide the services for which the charges are to be levied.

4. That the Secretary of this District be, and he is hereby, authorized and instructed to file a certified copy of this resolution with the County Auditor of San Benito County and to make copies of this Resolution available for public inspection in the District office.



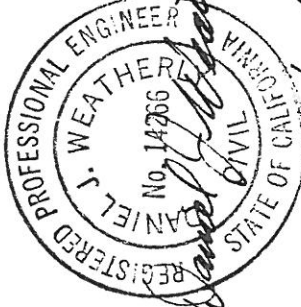

Number of services - 480. Annual shortage - \$3033/480 = 6.32/yr./service. Increase of \$1.00/mo./service is recommended.

Monthly sewer charges should cover monthly operating expenses plus depreciation. Connection fees are accumulated to offset capital expenditures. Since the special circumstances of this sewer system preclude the need for capital expenditures, a portion of the accumulated connection fees can be used to help offset the difference in expenses vs. revenue.

Total Administration and Depreciation should be covered by monthly minimum \$ 118,170/2250 = 52.52/yr. or \$4.38/mo. average. An increase in water rates is recommended as follows:
